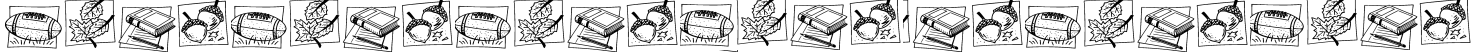

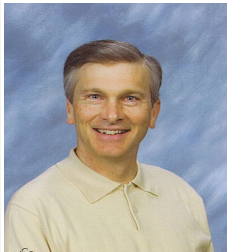

“INASMUCH as you have done it to the least of these, you have done it unto me.”

Learn more about this dynamic program created by David Crocker that is conducted in churches across the United States, Canada and now even in Europe. In the past several years, four Evansville churches have collaborated in an Operation Inasmuch program and have participated in a variety of mission projects in the one-day endeavor. Come and be inspired by David as he offers encouragement and suggestions for expanding the program to include other local churches.

The Samaritan Way

The second seminar will focus on a new program David has created that helps answer a question most people find themselves asking after participating in Operation Inasmuch – *“How can we make this more than a once-a-year ministry?”* He has written a new book entitled The Samaritan Way – Lifestyle Compassion Ministry. The following is a synopsis that has been written about this new book and explains the approach: *“Many church members get a taste of community ministry through church outreach events or week-long mission trips. But when the event is over, many are left with a yearning for more. They desire more frequent experiences of that kind of ministry, and want something that will change their lifestyle altogether.”*

The Operation Inasmuch website offers this information regarding their shift in emphasis with The Samaritan Way:

Operation Inasmuch will shift much of its focus to building the Kingdom one church at a time. The strategy is to promote biblical discipleship that gives appropriate priority to serving people in need in the local community, to equip congregations to become truly missional, and, finally, to multiply Samaritans. Operation Inasmuch will never abandon our promotion and training congregations to conduct one-day Inasmuch events, but going forward we will give greater emphasis to lifestyle ministry. This ministry is precisely what Jesus did and what he called the church to be about.

That phrase multiply Samaritans could use some explanation. In giving what we call the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus was providing a model of what it means to fulfill the most basic law of God—to love God totally and to love neighbor as much as self. When he said at the end of the parable, “go and do likewise,” he was saying – “THAT is what I want you to do. THAT is how I want you to live. And, by implication, THAT is what the church is supposed to be about!”
